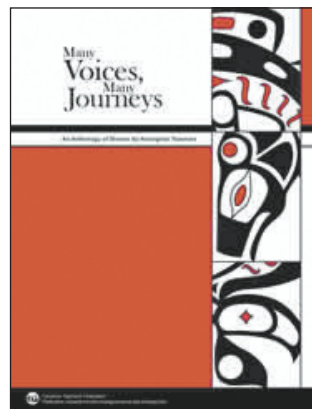


EQUITY COMMITTEE BOOK REVIEW
