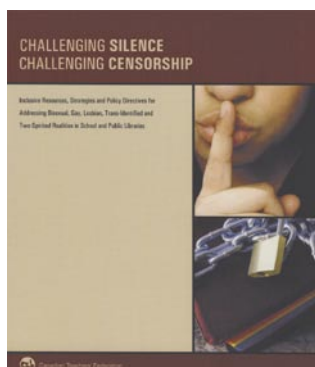


EQUITY COMMITTEE BOOK REVIEW

This month's book giveaway is *Challenging Silence, Challenging Censorship*.
